Farewell to LS 400

Geomatics Engineering Summer Design

Traditionally, LS 400 has been the summer design course that students in the Geomatics or Dual program have taken before their last year at Purdue. The course allows students to get out in the field and test their surveying skills in real world applications. The summer class of 2008 was no different, however, it had the distinction of being the last class to participate in this course. The course will no longer be offered due to the re-structuring of Geomatics at Purdue.

Four students were enrolled in the course in its final year: Mike Conley, Jason Gaspar, Jacob Hoffman, and Steve Seiler. Despite the low number of students, the scale and quality of the project did not deviate from the projects of previous years. The site chosen was the John S. Wright Forestry Center in Purdue's Martell Forest. The site had been mapped by previous LS 400 classes, but not since the Center officially opened on October 3, 2003. An updated topographic map was produced by the students that included the footprint of the new building and the other changes made to the site.

Martell Forest had recently acquired parcels to the South of the Wright Center and the employees in the Forestry department had not yet had a chance to explore these at the time of the course. The class volunteered to find the new boundary corners and describe them for the benefit of the department. Along with these descriptions, photographs were taken of the monuments to aid in their re-discovery.

The class learned field techniques such as collecting points using a total station to produce a topographic map, using GPS equipment to tie in distant control, and walking up steep, wet hills without falling down (Professor Johnson is stilling learning this one). Office skills were also developed. The students became proficient in drafting, least squares adjustment programs and how to conduct research at the County Building. They also learned that in large projects with many parcels described at different times, the probability of boundary discrepancies is greater than what we would like it to be.
